

The Red Circle assembled at Alfio's La Trattoria in Chevy Chase, Maryland for our second meeting of the year, and we enjoyed Alfio's offered their traditional Italian menu as well as their even more traditional spumoni.

Bev Wolov and Ross Davies explained that our scheduled guest speaker, Paxton Whitehead, had died earlier in June, and introduced our surprise substitute, Peter E Blau, while wearing light blue jackets and Snoopy-embroidered ties, honoring his traditional attire at the Saturday reception during the birthday festivities in New York.
